To graduate with Honors in Sociology, students must complete the above courses, have a cumulative GPA of 3.50 or higher in all UW Sociology courses and any other courses included in the Honors major. A UW GPA of at least 3.30. They must also successfully complete the Honors Thesis.

Where Honors requirements do not meet or exceed standard degree requirements for the BA in Sociology, Honors students must meet the standard BA requirements. If students do not complete all Honors requirements, Honors coursework will count as upper division credit toward standard BA course requirements.
