F. ADDITIONAL SOCIOLOGY ELECTIVES (20 CREDITS) 20 credits of additional SOC courses, at least 10 of which must be 300 level or above.		

To graduate with Honors in Sociology, students must complete the above courses, have a cumulative 3.50 GPA in UW Sociology and Statistics coursework and a 3.30 overall UW GPA at graduation. They must also successfully complete the Honors Thesis.

Where Honors requirements do not meet or exceed standard degree requirements for the BA in Sociology, Honors students must meet the standard BA requirements. If students do not complete all Honors requirements, Honors coursework will count as upper division credit toward standard BA course requirements.
