GENERAL SOC 499 INFORMATION

SOC 499 enables students to investigate areas of intellectual interest substantially distinct from existing courses, and/or to pursue modes of inquiry that are more intensive, specialized, or innovative than those encountered in conventional coursework. The content should be clearly sociological, and at least as demanding as that in other upper-level sociology courses. Students are expected to have exhausted the available formal courses relevant to their chosen subject and to have prepared themselves for undertaking such specialized study. A SOC 499 project should not overlap significantly with existing courses.

SOC 499 implies a tutorial contract between the student and faculty sponsor in which the student completes:

- a specific, supervised program of reading or research
- or the student works as a Research Assistant as part of a Faculty Research project, in a defined role, with obligations and tasks clearly outlined and agreed on and for which training is provided.
- In some situations, the RA may be part of a team of researchers.

The project proposal (page 3 of this document) should make the above explicit.

Students may enroll in SOC 499 for two to five credits per quarter unless other limits are specified (for a maximum ten credits total). Sociology majors may count no more than a **combined total** of five credits of SOC 499 and SOC 399 (Sociology Internship) toward sociology electives. SOC 499 credits **may not substitute for any other major requirement**. All 499 credit hours will be graded C/NC.
